In the top right corner on the top gray bar, next to the magnifying glass is what looks like a stack of layered papers icon. Once you push that there are several expanded areas, such as "Boundaries", you can turn off/turn of layers. Please know that we will have different software once we start looking at making boundary adjustments, so feel free to us this how you see fit until then.</p>
