American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 aka COVID-19 Stimulus Package or American Rescue Plan (ARP)

Passed by 117th US Congress

Signed into law by President Joe Biden on March 11, 2021

Prioritization


 Bring pandemic under control, fill budget shortfalls, one-time expenditures; existing assets, other funds used first
