1	<p>Welcome and Introductions If you could choose to have one training in the next two months, what topics would it be? David Dodson (Lane County Choice), Elisabeth Maxwell (Lane County PH), Terry (SLMH), Ameer (WhiteBird), Hayley Van Horn (LaneCare – TBH), Rustie Anderson (CFD), Cory Surrat (Laurel Hill), Jennifer (Options), John Jones & Jim Brann (Vet Center), Carlyn Weirda, Rachel Fischer (PSCS), Britni D’Eliso (PacificSource), Ryan Federmeier (PacificSource).</p> <p>Answers to training question: GoToMeeting/ Technology Training, Outreach training. Training for supervisors on how to help underperforming staff. Measure 110 happenings and Psilocybin training on benefits, research, and treatments. Creating safe space for challenging conversations. Training for new programs and shelters that are coming soon. Reflective Supervision for Clinical staff. Compassion Fatigue for clinical staff; Life after COVID-19, processes and procedures. Tips on therapy in-office; semantics; sexualized behavior in youth. Creating plans for folks who test positive with COVID-19. Clinicians who identify as a part of a marginalized community and how to support these staff when placed in a difficult situation with clients.</p>

3	<p>BHASC Champions/ Shout Outs — Anyone you want to recognize? Shawn Murphy has recently joined the Trillium Board! Shala Molina and Denise Jubber for starting the MOUD (Medication for Opioid Use Disorder) Treatment program at the LC Jail. Mark Harris for steering the work of the BHASC Equity & Inclusion workgroup training focus.</p> <p>Announcements: 3 clinicians at Options for Child Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) and prioritizing ECMH clients. Options also has openings for bilingual clients in need of mental health services.</p> <p>CFD is training a therapist cohort for CPP and also has openings.</p> <p>Relief Nursery is working in the McKenzie Fire area to bring a trauma recovery focused short term program.</p>
4	<p>Training Discussion Send out the training flyer for NAACP training for how to build trust and be an anti-racist for healthcare and healing professionals.</p> <p>The Healthcare Integration Collaborative is looking at Lunch and Learn model around integration topics. The training topics shared today will be shared with the HIC.</p>
5	<p>Brief Update of Workgroup Reports: a) Early Childhood Mental Health (ECMH) Rotating facilitator model and breakout groups are working well. The Integration & Collaboration group is working on a media story for ECMH and finalizing the plan for outreach and education based on collated response data from a survey they conducted. The</p>

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Training group is working on bringing needed training to the ECMH provider community, focusing on Child Parent Psychotherapy to start. Putting together funding proposals as well.

- b) Substance Use Disorders (SUDS)** WF is piloting an outpatient MOUD program – currently only available to existing WF outpatient clients. Group discussed relevant legislative updates and learned about the Survivors Project (art media of the lives now of folks who survived a suicide attempt).
- c) Adult/Severe Persistent Mental Illness/Crisis (Adult SPMI)** ongoing conversation about access to care, the HIC, and how the efforts of these groups can be supported to help the SPMI population move through levels of care. Heard about .370 services Lane County is providing. Workforce discussion about lack of psychiatrist.
- d) Older Adults and People with Disabilities (OA-PWD)** focused on social isolation and trauma and trying to support the senior companion models and community service approaches. Recently printed a health and wellness guide to be delivered with meals on wheels program and to community programs. Found here:

- e) Young Adults/Transition Age Youth Workgroup (TAY)** – We are ending this as a BHASC Workgroup because Direction Service has received a TAY grant and is supporting this work now. System of Care will work closely with the Healthy Transitions team at Direction Service. Leilani will still be attending this workgroup so if anyone is interested in updates they can be given during the SOC report out time on the BHASC agendas. We are so glad this has become a sustainable initiative in the community!
- f) Equity and Inclusion Workgroup (E & I)** convened a SOGI (Sexual Orientation/Gender Identity) mini-workgroup. Lucy asked the group about the SOGI term being used worldwide and shared challenges and barriers for this population that were identified in their first meeting. There is interest in doing a BHASC Summit on this topic after summer.
- g) Community Resilience Workgroup (CRW)** looking at the Trauma Intervention Program which is being done in Portland to see what it would take to replicate in Lane County – TIP provides support (not therapy or de-escalation) to a trauma victim, connection with resources and follow up after 30 days. Volunteers are dispatched by the emergency response system.
- h) BHASC Access Workgroup** launched last month to identify group priorities – emphasis on how the CCOs and OHA can help solve the lack of BH workforce problem. Rapid Engagement Model presentation from OHA coming soon to be discussed hand in hand with the current challenges to workforce. Meeting on June 15th from 11am-12pm (3rd Tuesdays). Britni can send folks the invite.

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6	System of Care Update SOC technology resource funds are available for children and young adults who are involved in child/youth serving systems (up to age 26), visit www.lanecounty.org/soc
7	Lane County Pain Guidance & Safety Alliance Send call for proposal for the OPG conference out to the group. OR Recovers Walk for Recovery and Summit sponsorship and information will also be sent.
8	CHOICE Update SLMH created a new bed to help with placing someone who was displaced due to one of the foster homes closing. The State has supported the opening of one new residential treatment facility in Medford, where one Lane County residents was able to be placed.
9	Clinical Advisory Panel Reports from CCOs PSCS: the medical and specialty medical providers have requested support for youth and others who present BH crisis or concerns – a guide has been created to get ahold of someone who can help the providers. OPAL outreach to providers is also a focus. TCHP: focus on vaccination clinics.
