Executive Summary

The Holiday Farm Fire burned over 173,000 acres of timber, over 1100 structures 36 miles of highway 126 East. The town of Blue River, experienced a total loss of all commercial property, the postal service, library, and the local clinic. The fire had significant impacts the single drinking water source for the Eugene/Springfield population. Displaced over 500 residents.

This request provides for Professional & Consulting costs dedicated to providing access to the Hazard Mitigation Program on behalf of Lane County Emergency Management (EM). Since the allocated funds are limited in time, EM is requesting these consulting costs to apply for available HMG funds to support the McKenzie Fire recovery efforts.

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The long-term disaster recovery manager is a two-year position and is responsible for planning and coordinating fire recovery activities and projects; collaborating with partners in the government, private, and non-profit sectors; and preparing and delivering reports and making recommendations in accordance with FEMA disaster recovery guidelines.
